Self-Guided Tour

- Begin your tour at the main entrance (**5th Floor**) of the law school in the **William B. Aycock Lobby**. The main entrance is located in front of the circular driveway, underneath the portico. The Parking Coordinator & Receptionist will greet you. Across from the front desk is the **Marion A. Cowell Jr. Board Room**, where meetings and events are held for faculty, staff, students and visitors.
- As you walk further into the law school, you will approach the staircase leading down. Before walking downstairs, to your left through the double glass doors is the **Wade and Andy Hargrove Student Services Suite**. It includes the offices of **Admissions, Student Services, the Registrar, Financial Aid, and Public Service**. The double glass doors on your right access the **John T. Manning Dean's Suite**. It includes the **Administrative Offices** for **Facilities & Planning, Finance, Human Resources, Communications** and the **Dean**.
- As you walk down the stairs, you enter the **Rotunda (4th Floor)** where the students socialize, student organizations recruit new members, and visiting speakers give lectures. Please note the colorful paintings around the **Rotunda** walls. This art was done by Nan Kirby Gressman and donated to the law school by her husband, Professor Eugene Gressman. To the left of the **Rotunda** is the **Judith Wegner Alumni Courtyard**, which is a great place to enjoy the great outdoors while you study. The **Law Bar Snack Shop and Dining Area** — where you can buy snacks, Starbucks coffee, or prepared lunches from well-known local restaurants like Mediterranean Deli and Cosmic Cantina — is also adjacent to the **Rotunda**.
- Enter the **Kathrine R. Everett Law Library** through the wood-paneled double doors just off the **Rotunda**. Look to your left, and see the main floor reading room, a popular place for law students to study. Walk toward the high-ceiling main room, and you'll pass the Circulation Desk and then the Reference Desk where lawyer librarians provide guidance on finding information from databases containing nearly half a billion individual publications. Take the elevator or stairs down one floor to find classrooms, group study rooms with technology, study carrels, and library stacks. Imagine the legal history, current law, and insights about the law that are available to you through the library's databases and print collections!
- As you leave the Law Library, walk back through the **Rotunda** and before reaching the main stairs, turn to your right. Immediately on your right, before you get to the door to the **Courtyard**, there is a flight of stairs that go down to our newly redecorated **Rumpus Room**, or student lounge, complete with a large flat panel TV, plenty of couches and a

ping pong table. Our student organizations (more than 50) also have their offices on this floor.

- Back up to the 4th floor and down the hallway on your right, you will see **Classrooms** on your left and a view of the **Courtyard** on your right. If a **Classroom** is not in use, feel free to enter, take a seat and imagine being a student at **UNC School of Law**. Down the hallway on your left, you will see the newly renovated, high-tech **Graham Kenan Courtroom**, where students learn and practice actual trial skills. At the end of the hall is the **Career Development Office (CDO)** and **International Programs**. Feel free to walk in and say hello.
- Down the stairwell that is across from the **CDO** you'll find the **Clinical Programs Offices** on the **3rd Floor** and another access point to the Courtyard. If you go up the same stairs to the 5th Floor and take two quick rights, you'll arrive at the wing housing our **Faculty Offices, Faculty Support** and **Faculty Lounge**. Upon returning to the entrance to the **5th Floor** stairs, continue to walk down the hallway so that the **Classrooms** are on your right and the **Courtyard** is on your left.
- As you approach the end of the hallway, turn left and enjoy the birds-eye view of the **Rotunda**. If you continue walking around the study areas, you can enter the double glass doors to the **Quiet Study Room** and the **Writing & Learning Resources Center**, which serves UNC law students at all levels through courses, peer tutoring and individual consultations to help guide them as they adjust to law study, bar requirements and professional life.
- Return through the circular study area overlooking the **Rotunda** to make your way back to the Front Desk. Thank you for your interest in UNC School of Law!
