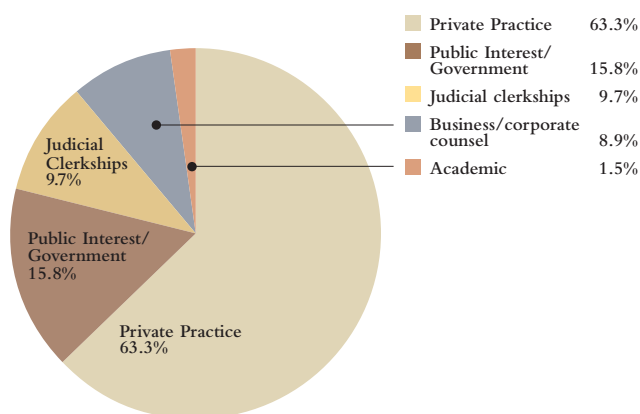

SALARY INFORMATION

Salary information was reported by 68% of our employed graduates in the Class of 2008. The starting salaries ranged from a minimum of \$31,000 to a maximum of \$160,000. The median starting salary for the class was \$100,000, and the average starting salary was \$100,147. The median starting salary for graduates entering into private practice was \$130,000. Graduates entering into the public sector (including nonprofits, government and legal services organizations) had a median starting salary of \$46,000; for graduates entering into judicial clerkships, the median was \$47,500.
